# A Message from the President

ID SHEPPARD PT, DPT

During our 2022 legislative session in Annapolis, APTA Maryland has been devoted to improving access to care for Marylanders. We have met with legislators, professional societies, and patient groups to rally support for our bill. High co-pays continue to limit patient access to medically necessary care, disproportionately affects underrepresented groups, and has the potential to negatively impact the opioid epidemic in our state.

As you know APTAMD introduced a bipartisan sponsored bill to address fair copays (HB 974/SB 725) as it would prohibit insurers, nonprofit health service plans, and health maintenance organizations from imposing a co-payment, co-insurance, or deductible for covered physical therapy services that is greater than the co-payment, co-insurance, or deductible imposed for a primary care visit under the same plan or contract. The House and Senate committees voted to refer the bill for study over the summer. APTA Maryland developed a list of concerns and questions for the Maryland Health Care Commission to study. These questions have been approved by our bill sponsors and we are now awaiting the House and Senate's approval. A report is due to be given to the legislators by December 1, 2022.

Our attention now shifts to the upcoming gubernatorial elections as our PAC and government relations committee meet to discuss fundraising and key legislators we wish to support.

Addressing Social Determinants of Health including information on Maryland 2-1-1:
 The Missing Link to Addressing Social Determinants of Health

Social determinants of health (SDOH) are conditions in the environments in which people were born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks. SDOH contributes up to 80% of a patient's health outcome and contribute to wide health disparities and inequities. In our current system, patients' health-related social needs frequently remain undetected and unaddressed.

This course will look at SDOH in PT and guide participant through the Race Implicit Association Test and explore ways you and the health system can mitigate the impact of bias. In addition, you will learn about efforts emerging to integrate social and environmental needs into the health care system and match patient needs with community resources. An inventory of resources was identified as an important component of linking health care delivery sites to social and community resources. The most cited current resource inventory was United Way's 2-1-1 which you will learn how to access and connect your patients and their families to needed resources.



## Survey Open - Respond Today to Inform Future Telehealth Policy in Maryland!

THE MARYLAND HEALTH CARE COMMISSION INVITES ELIGIBLE PROVIDERS

TO PARTICIPATE IN AN ONLINE TELEHEALTH SURVEY

- WHAT: NORC at the University of Chicago is conducting an online survey of provider experiences providing telehealth services using audio-video or audio-only technology. The survey should take no more than 15 minutes; responses are voluntary and confidential.
- WHO: The following eligible providers may access the survey using their National Provider Identifier (NPI) active as of 10/1/2021:
  - Primary care providers, specialty providers engaged in primary care, and nurse practitioners
  - Behavioral health providers (psychiatrists, psychologists, licensed certified social workers, and licensed professional counselors)
- WHEN: Now! The online survey is available at mdtelesurvey.norc.org.
- WHY: Responses to the telehealth survey are VERY IMPORTANT and will be used to inform recommendations on audio-visual and audio-only coverage and reimbursement for Maryland's 2023 legislative session. Please respond promptly!



As part of women's history month, we conducted an interview with Dr. Caruth on her path to PT and her passion for paying it forward.

#### What's one word to describe you? Why?

**Evolving**, because I realize that I don't know everything and even my opinions re subject to change. But my principles stay steady. We live in a world where the majority of people don't lean in to understanding the background of others and that is the root cause of racism and xenophobia in our society.

#### What women inspires your work today? Why?

If I go back to childhood, I would pick my mother. Growing up I didn't quite understand how much she sacrificed. She got pregnant with me at 20 and 2 years later she had my sister and then 4 years after my younger sibling. She was a 25-year-old new wife and mom with no high school education. My dad had limited high school education too. They were able to sacrifice and work hard so we were well educated which they saw as key to our future. My siblings and I were all college educated and raised with love, encouragement, unconditional love, and support.

I recently came out and declared that I am a lesbian. Growing up in a very spiritual home in the Caribbean, I was afraid of disappointing my mother and it was such a huge relief that she embraced me with unconditional love. That has inspired me even more. I am more open, and more content and the reason is that I know no matter what happens, I have her love.

#### What opportunity are you most proud of to date? Why?

I enjoy being with students. I know how challenging it was when I was seeking a mentor during and after PT school. I had a desire to own my own business and was shot down by a lot of people. I try to be the mentor that I didn't have to inspire those interested in being a business owner in the PT field, sharing the realities and helping them to find a balance. This is what I enjoy the most so far.

I am so grateful that APTAMD took the initiative to create a DEI space and develop a mentorship program where I can inspire others including high school students. I am blessed to share the value I see with others as well because you see more engagement in membership.

#### What would be your advice to girls out there that want to be where you are?

You have to believe in yourself. In each and every one of us, we have desires, and we question them. You can get stuck in focusing on what other people think of you and your decisions, so I advise them to believe in yourself, trust that you have a purpose to fill, surround yourself with people who will love you and encourage you and help you find open doors to advance your personal goals and dreams.
